Security Summary

The 2022 fall season is around winterize and store your vessel. stored on a lot, be sure to park it it's not within easy access for unwanted individuals. A padlock on the hitch of the trailer will hinder any attempt to hook and drive away with the vessel. Remove all valuables. Keep in mind, there is no parking of vehicles over 24 hours on the rights-of-way, unless an approved designated parking area has been made. Then, the vehicle must be 12 inches from the edge of the driving portion of the roadway. There is no parking on the driving portion of the roadway.

If you, as a lot owner, have or intend to have a vehicle parked on your property be sure it is licensed and in operable condition. This means no flat tires, no leaking fluids, no broken windows, no grass growing up around the vehicle, etc. These types of inoperable vehicles are in violation of the BLA covenants, and this type of violation brings an eyesore to the community.

There is a curfew on noise in the Beaver Lake Association area from 10:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. Sunday through Thursday and midnight to 8:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday. At no time is persistent, excessive noise permitted. Home maintenance and repair are excluded. Any time one violates another's peace within reason it's classified as disturbing the peace and carries a fine of \$50-\$500. The extra loud fireworks or explosions that occur are classified as offensive and are cited as such. Please think of your neighbors before taking action or any activity that may end up costing you.

Please pay attention to the sign at the brush dump site. As a reminder, only tree limbs, brush and leaves without plastic bags are accepted. Construction lumber and any other materials are not allowed. Violations will result in a \$300 fine.

Infrastructure Facilities Review

Beaver Lake provides our members plenty of options for fun and activity! Here's a quick guide to some of our greatest attractions.

[Clubhouse]

The Beaver Lake clubhouse hosts board and committee meetings plus many club functions. It's available to rent by members. Find more information in our [Handbook](#).



[Pavilions] Three covered pavilions on the lake side of the clubhouse are available for members. Pavilions have 110v outlets, and are available first-come, first-serve or by rental. Contact the office at 402-235-2241 for information on availability and rates.

[Swimming Pool] The outdoor pool is open from noon – 7 pm, weather permitting. The season

runs daily from Memorial Day until when school begins, and after that, on weekends until Labor Day. Contact the office at 402-235-2241 about pool rental as well!



[Boat Ramp] Our three-lane boat ramp with two docks is just east of the marina on Weeping Water Court. Indoor restroom facilities with handicap access are available. See the [Handbook](#) for more information.

[Access Lots] Members can fish from our lakeside access lots, or just relax and have fun. Fishing and property use are for members only. Guests must be accompanied by a member in good standing. State law governs fishing restrictions.

[Nature Preserve] Beaver Lake's Nature Preserve is south of the dam and east of the Water Treatment Plant. Walk along the path and hear water making its way into Rock Creek. It's also a great place to watch for wildlife any time of year.

[Walking Trail] We also have a walking trail on the west side near the pipeline, accessible from Beaver Lake Boulevard or Elk Lane. Signs mark its location.



[Campground] Check out our nine-site campground at the southeast side of the lake off Murray Road. Restrooms and showers are available seasonally. Campground is for use by members and their guests by permit only.

Fishing Club News

The Beaver Lake Fishing Club is meeting the needs of the Association's fishermen and fisherwomen. In 2022 we've topped last year's record of 107 members with 114 so far. Couple this with averaging 46 attendees at our 2022 monthly meetings (high of 56), it shows strong club growth, but it hardly tells the entire story. Members present techniques at our meetings to help others improve their fishing plus we share our successes and discuss techniques. This year's Spaghetti Feed set records with funds raised while serving 234 people some good eats! Our success with fundraising has allowed us to increase our fish stocking donations to the Association stocking program each of the past 3-years along with supporting various charities. The club purchased the material, volunteered the labor and built PVC fish structure this year and in conjunction with the Lake and Habitat committee placed them in Army Corp of Engineers approved locations.

Our annual Kids Derby in June hosted 98 children 12 and below along with 75 parents/guardians. For many of the kids this was their 1st introduction to fishing. Watching them catch a fish and then watching them "all" receive their prizes is priceless! More importantly, we're helping introduce the joy of fishing to the next generations.

Our annual membership fish fry was well attended even with the overcast conditions giving way to sunny skies later in the day and many people brought side dishes, and everyone enjoyed some very good food.



Even with the extreme heat late spring and summer the crappie fishing has remained very good. The largemouth bass are on a downhill trend with very few larger fish being caught. The Smallmouth bass [some very big] and walleye are being caught on several different types of baits. Catfishing has been good as well.

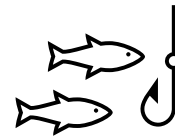
I would like to thank all the volunteers, individuals and businesses who have helped with all our events, lending their time and donating to a great cause.
