

Election Notice

▼ Important Election Information **▼**

Beaver Lake Association members have a choice of voting by proxy via email or in person at the clubhouse in our elections. All regular members get one ballot per fees-paying membership, whether voting by proxy or in person.

Members who choose to vote by proxy must register each year on our website. Annual registration is available between January 1 and the last Friday in April. If you own multiple lots, register each one separately.

Proxy Voting

When you register to e-vote, you will need to provide your lot number, name of registered lot owner, and an email you can access during election weekend.

Be sure your lot number is correct. Be sure you can access that email during election weekend.

On the Friday evening of election weekend, you will receive an email with a link to your electronic ballot. Multiple lot registrants will receive separate emails for each lot. You will have until 3 pm on election Sunday to vote.

To vote, click the link to open your ballot, select your choices, confirm, and submit.

About two weeks before the annual meeting and election, all members will receive a notice of annual meeting and election, along with the list of candidates and their bios.

- ► Signing up for our email newsletter does NOT register you to e-vote.
- ► Previous registration to e-vote does NOT register you to e-vote in subsequent elections. Annual registration keeps our voter lists up to date.
- ▶ If you register to e-vote by proxy, you will be ineligible to vote in person too.

Those who do not register to e-vote by proxy may vote in person at the clubhouse on the day of the election.

Remember, if you want to vote by proxy in the coming election, registration begins in January.

Fishing Club News & Schedule

Hello everyone! The hard water season is upon us. Like it or not, it's inevitable here every year for at least a short time. We have lots of ice fishermen that use our lake. I'm starting to get reports of lots of nice crappie, bluegill, bass and even catfish being caught through the ice. From what I've heard the ice is anywhere from 6" to 10" inches thick and will probably be thicker by the time this article comes out. Please remember, **no ice is safe ice**. Always check the thickness often when out on any body of water. A quick reminder from our security, please have your lot number visible if you are using an ice hut. Have lot number facing the road, if possible, so it can be easily seen. Some ice huts are made from material that the sticky numbers simply won't adhere to. My suggestion was to use a 1\4 inch piece of plywood with lot number on it and hang it from the hut. Also, remember, with the new year comes the need for a new fishing license.

I can't fail to mention that spring is just a few months away. With that being said, the Beaver Lake Fishing Club's yearly **Spaghetti Feed** is fast approaching. This year it will be held on **March 1**st **from 5:00 to 8:00 pm** at the clubhouse. I encourage everyone to come out and support the club. In past years, your donations and club dues have gone towards fish stocking, benches at the boat ramp, clubhouse and new tables and chairs in the clubhouse. Infrastructure Committee

Capital Projects Note – Submitted by the Infrastructure Committee

The concept for Beaver Lake began as a 1969 land purchase, with design and development following. With timely maintenance, our infrastructure has served us well – but we recognize how crucial it is to protect our assets by repairing and replacing them before an emergency arises.

Every fall the Infrastructure Committee revises its five-year capital projects plan and request list. The five-year plan names specific projects; their location; a cost estimate; priority ranking; what year to begin; current status; and significant remarks.

The Finance Committee then determines how much we can afford, after which the Board reviews the committees' recommendations and establishes BLA's annual budget. The cost of capital projects increases each year; the allocation for 2025 is \$966,575.

Because the cost of recommended projects always exceeds the capital budget, four years ago Infrastructure identified and compiled a list of anticipated projects that could be expected to fall outside the funding for capital projects available from dues alone. Estimated costs need to be adjusted annually for inflation.

Below is a truncated synopsis of Infrastructure's anticipated future project needs (a few have since been addressed). Neither the dam nor the southwest culvert was originally included. It is reasonable given Beaver Lake's age to expect other unforeseen infrastructure needs and the consequent requirement for additional funds.

WATER Distribution System - \$734,000

- Replace water main valves and fittings. Because of the design and age of the 153 existing double disc gate valves, they will be replaced with modern bubble tight rubber wedge type valves - \$60,000
- Replace three high service pumps (2005 vintage) for the clear well \$50,000
- Install 10 additional fire hydrants to accommodate community growth \$70,000
- Replace PAC (powder activated carbon) feeder installed in 2005 \$200,000
- Repair interior of clear well (oxidation compartments) \$200,000
- Replace three 25-year-old raw water pumps \$102,000
- Replace online analyzers because of age and malfunctions \$52,000

SEWAGE Collection System - \$3.072M

- Replace truss pipe with PVC on Beaver Lake Boulevard (SW cove) \$30,000
- Purchase emergency portable backup generator for lift stations \$42,000
- Possible need for new buildings, relocation, and dewatering equipment \$3M

BUILDINGS - \$2.605M

- Purchase emergency stationary generator for clubhouse (CH) \$40,000
- Update existing CH to comply with ADA (American with Disabilities Act)- \$1M
- CH A/C and furnaces 29 years old \$35,000
- Relocate new pool with restrooms/showers and Coconuts (currently spend \$10,000 per year on patching pool) - \$1.5M
- Maintenance shop storage \$30,000

ROADS - \$3M

- Resurface two-inch asphalt overlay. With an annual allocation of \$200,000 we only accomplish 1/8 of a mile at a time. We have 27+ miles of roads. At this rate it takes 20 years to complete the job. Total -\$2M
- Replace failing culverts at SW cove (added in 2025) \$1M

VEHICLES/EQUIPMENT - \$520,000

- Replace tractor \$80,000
- Replace 1997 Case 621 loader (used parts not available)- \$350,000
- Replace 2011 Chevy Silverado 1-ton truck + dump box \$90,000

COMMON ACCESS/SPECIAL USAGE, DOCKS, CAMPGROUND - \$146,000

- Enhance boat dock addition at clubhouse \$54,000
- Repair boat ramp 3rd lane (additional concrete slab in water)- \$22,000
- Create a third lane at boat ramp to help traffic flow and safety- \$22,000
- Extend west levee for safety and to prevent sand migration \$18,000
- Install wave break system for safety when loading and unloading boats \$30,000

DAM (added in 2024) - \$TBD

Scope as yet unknown – cost as yet unknown

TOTAL KNOWN COSTS EXCLUDING THE DAM - \$10.077M



Winter Snow Removal Reminders

As winter approaches, there are a few things I would like to remind everyone about. Nobody likes to deal with removing pesky snow in the winter, but it must be done. As we accomplish the snow removal

for the Association, we must get the snow as far off the road as possible, especially if there are continuing back-to-back snowfalls. Remember, that if you have a parking area near the road, please get your vehicle as far from the road as possible to avoid damage from flying snow, ice, rocks, etc. When the snow is blowing and it is dark out, it is hard for the drivers to see everything, but the job must be accomplished. As far as mailboxes around the lake are concerned, expect that there may be some damage to them. Many times, the boxes are broken due to heavy, wet snow or a good volume of snow hitting them. Please understand that when it is that cold out, plastic mailboxes don't stand up to the task. We also find that many of the mailboxes have rotten posts that break off. Per the Beaver Lake Handbook, if a mailbox is broken due to snow hitting it, the responsibility of repair lies with the property owner. If the BLA snowplow backs into or hits the box, the Association will repair it. If your mailbox has been knocked over, please contact us and I will review the case to see if it has been hit by a truck or the flying snow. Snow removal is a dangerous and exhausting task. Please be vigilant and get away from the street when you see or hear a snowplow approaching. This will keep you safe because that driver may not see you, depending on the conditions. Lastly, everyone knows how frustrating it is when the plow goes by and puts snow in your driveway. Please do not shovel or blow the snow back out into the road. Throw it or blow it off in the yard. We may come by 2 or 3 times depending on the longevity of the snowfall and it will wind up back in your driveway. We appreciate everyone's patience during these snowfall events. Be safe and have a great fall and winter.

Important Announcement: New Watercraft Pre-Approval Process

We are pleased to inform you about a new update regarding the acquisition of watercraft in our community. To enhance safety and compliance, we are introducing a pre-approval process for all new watercraft purchases.

Watercraft

Dre-Approval

Starting January 1, 2025, all "new-to-you" watercraft must submit a pre-approval request before bringing the watercraft into our community. This ensures that all new watercraft adhere to our safety and environmental standards.

How to Submit a Pre-Approval Request:

- Complete the Watercraft Pre-Approval Form available at https://forms.office.com/r/3QcHJi0tRV
- 2. Provide detailed information about the watercraft, including type, size, and safety features.
- 3. Submit the completed form online.

Once your request is reviewed, you will receive confirmation from the Beaver Lake Patrol office. Please ensure all newly purchased watercraft are approved before use to avoid any inconvenience.

* Pet License Due Date Update

We would like to inform you of an important update regarding pet licensing within our community. The due date for obtaining or renewing pet licenses has been changed to May 1st. To make the process more convenient, licenses can now be obtained online.
