President's Message

Presidents Newsletter 1 Mar 25

Hopefully everyone is staying warm. It's sadly -8 degrees as I write this, so talking about Spring and boating seems like a stretch, but here goes anyway. First, I want to mention a new service on boat purchases. Starting January 1, 2025, all "new-to-you" watercraft must submit a pre-approval request before bringing the watercraft into our community. This ensures that all new watercraft adhere to our size, safety, and environmental standards. It is important to know our size limits on boats BEFORE purchasing. Here's a Linkfor New Watercraft

Sadly, the lake level is very low after a dry fall and dry winter. I don't have the exact measurement due to the ice, but most likely somewhere around 2' down. If we don't get substantial rain, we'll be looking at watering restrictions and no wake boating restrictions. Please familiarize yourself with flag poles located at the boat ramp and AL 14. A yellow flag indicates the entire lake is NO WAKE and a red flag indicates NO BOATING. There is also a strobe light at the beach that flashes yellow or red to indicate the same. Stay tuned as we get into Spring and let's hope for rain.

If you haven't had a chance yet, please take a minute to read the dam reports posted in the news section of the BLA page. Here is a link to the newest <u>Dam Report</u> Updates are provided monthly at board meetings.

The zebra mussel breeding season will begin again when the water temp gets up to 60 degrees this Spring. A substantial winter kill due to the falling water levels should knock them back again substantially. Don't forget to check your water intakes often, work your shore stations periodically, and keep your lower units out of the water. Please always remember there are other invasive species we don't want in our lake like quagga mussels, Eurasian Milfoil, Hydrilla, etc... Bottom-line, we still need to protect against the spread of invasives into our lake and from our lake to others. BIG Update on the "lot sales" initiative

Your BLA Board of Directors is dedicated to maintaining and enhancing the safety and quality of life within our community. We are informing you about a crucial decision we are placing in your hands for the upcoming election; the sale of underutilized residential lots currently owned by the Association to raise funds for essential <u>dam</u> and lake <u>inflow</u> repairs.

I know this is a change from modernization efforts previously targeted for the funds, but just like in our personal finances, adjustments must be made for priority issues. You can't spend your money to replace the carpet when the furnace goes out!

Background on "lot sales" effort:

In February 2024, the Board introduced a comprehensive initiative that would update our covenants and accomplish **four key objectives**:

1) Protect our access lots by requiring member approval before any sales (see updated BLA <u>Handbook</u>, Section I. Covenants, Residential, #17)

- 2) Renumber our access lots sequentially around the lake (per attached Map).
- **3)** Rezone two rarely used reserve lots on the north side of Rock Bluff Road as residential equestrian lots.
- **4)** Sell those two newly created equestrian lots plus four other rarely used residential lots which the Association pays taxes and maintains

The purpose of selling those residential lots was to raise money three ways: through the purchase amount; owners' annual dues; and maint./water costs borne by the new owners.

Some of those initiatives have been approved and implemented, and some lots offered for sale. One of the equestrian lots has sold. The other 5.12-acre equestrian lot and lot 1030 are still available. (See photos and info on page 4.) Contact the office if interested. The question of selling the remaining three residential lots (462, 719, and 968) will be included in your May 2025 ballot.

Importance of Dam Repairs:

The dam is obviously crucial to everything about Beaver Lake living - managing water levels, providing water, ensuring the viability of our homes, and allowing the multiple recreation opportunities we enjoy. Due to aging, extensive repairs are essential to ensure the structural integrity and functionality are maintained. These repairs are vital to protect our resources and ensure there's no negative impact on our community.

Importance of Inflow Repairs:

The "inflow" at Beaver Lake Boulevard and Fire Lane suffered an age-related collapse and will require engineering, repairs, and modernization. A rain event could threaten the road, sewer main, and water main that function "above" the collapsed pipe and under the Beaver Lake Boulevard at that location.

Benefits of Selling the Underutilized Residential Lots 462, 719, and 968:

- Funding Critical Repairs: The primary benefit of selling these lots is to generate funds to cover the costs of the dam and inflow repairs. This allows us to address this urgent need without imposing additional financial burdens on members through special assessments.
- 2. **Financial Stability:** By utilizing the proceeds from the sale, we can ensure that Beaver Lake remains financially stable and well-prepared for future needs. This protective measure would help us avoid financial strains.
- 3. **Community Safety:** Ensuring the dam and inflow are in optimal condition is paramount for the viability of all residents. Properly funded repairs will mitigate risks and provide peace of mind, knowing that our community infrastructure is secure.
- Property Value Protection: Well-maintained infrastructure, including a fully functional inflow and dam, contributes to the overall appeal and value of our properties. Promptly addressing these repairs helps protect our investments and community.

Due diligence

We'd ask that everyone please conduct their due diligence by researching and examining lots 462, 719, and 968. Do you use any of these lots? Have you ever seen anyone else using these lots? (See photos on page 3.) Please consider whether it is in the association's best interest to keep and maintain these lots or to sell them to raise revenue.

Please understand that if the membership votes not to sell, an alternate method for paying for the dam and inflow projects will have to be shared by the members. We're working on garnering FEMA money to lessen Association costs, but that may be more problematic with efforts to reduce the size of government. Definitely TBD!

We want to ensure that *all* homeowners can vote on what is best for Beaver Lake Association. The ballot in May will contain each of the designated lots for your vote. Your participation in voting is crucial. Please enroll to vote electronically on the Association's website https://www.beaverlakene.org/register-to-e-vote/ or vote in person at the clubhouse between 1 and 3 pm on May 18, 2025.


Summer Employment at BLA

Mowing Notice

Attention Please!

This notice is regarding your lot at Beaver Lake. This is your one and only notice to mow and maintain your lot and road right-of-way during the 2025 mowing season. You <u>will not</u> be given notice each time your lot needs mowed. If the length of the grass, weeds, or any other growth reaches or exceeds 15" in length (as stated in the Beaver Lake Handbook,) it

will be mowed under the direction of Beaver Lake Association at a cost of \$125 per mowing of the lot or \$62.50 per mowing of the ditch and/or embankments. The cost of the mowing will be billed to the owner of record.

Once the owner receives a bill for mowing, it must be paid within 30 days. After 30 days delinquent, the account is turned over to the Association attorney for processing. The Beaver Lake Association does not wish to be in the mowing business, so we are asking that you please make arrangements for your lot to be mowed and maintained until the growth stops in late October. Remember that the mowing responsibility includes the road right-of-way. If you have any questions about the location of your lot, please notify us at 402-235-2241. Mowing contractors can be found on the Beaver Lake website. Please utilize one of them and save yourself some money. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

▼ Important Election Information **▼**

Beaver Lake Association members have a choice of voting by proxy via email or in person at the clubhouse in our elections. All regular members get one ballot per feespaying membership, whether voting by proxy or in person.

Members who choose to vote by proxy must register each year on our website. Annual registration is available between January 1 and the last Friday in April. If you own multiple lots, register each one separately.

Proxy Voting

When you register to e-vote, you will need to provide your lot number, name of registered lot owner, and an email you can access during election weekend.

Be sure your lot number is correct. Be sure you can access that email during election weekend.

On the Friday evening of election weekend, you will receive an email with a link to your electronic ballot. Multiple lot registrants will receive separate emails for each lot. You will have until 3 pm on election Sunday to vote.

To vote, click the link to open your ballot, select your choices, confirm, and submit.

About two weeks before the annual meeting and election, all members will receive a notice of annual meeting and election, along with the list of candidates and their bios.

- Signing up for our email newsletter does NOT register you to e-vote.
- ► Previous registration to e-vote does NOT register you to e-vote in subsequent elections. Annual registration keeps our voter lists up to date.
- ► If you register to e-vote by proxy, you will be ineligible to vote in person too.

Those who do not register to e-vote by proxy may vote in person at the clubhouse on the day of the election.

Remember, if you want to vote by proxy in the coming election, registration begins in January.

Starting January 1, 2025, all "new-to-you" watercraft must submit a pre-approval request before bringing the watercraft into our community. This ensures that all new watercraft adhere to our safety and environmental standards.

How to Submit a Pre-Approval Request:

- Complete the Watercraft Pre-Approval Form available at https://forms.office.com/r/3QcHJi0tRV
- 2. Provide detailed information about the watercraft, including type, size, and safety features.
- 3. Submit the completed form online.

Once your request is reviewed, you will receive confirmation from the Beaver Lake Patrol office. Please ensure all newly purchased watercraft are approved before use to avoid any inconvenience.

- Strong swimming ability and comfort working in various weather conditions.
- Ability to work weekends and holidays.
- Previous experience as a first responder, lifeguard or security is preferred
