2025 Lawn Watering Restrictions

Effective April 1, 2025, all Beaver Lake Properties are under lawn watering restrictions due to the lake level being down as we move into spring. Lawn watering restrictions are enacted by the Board of Directors when the lake level is down 12" or more. Currently we are 15" low. You can see the current lake level and temperature by going to the link on the front page of the Beaver Lake website. The lawn watering restrictions work as follows. If your address ends in an even number, you may water your lawn on even numbered days of the month. If your address ends in an odd number, you may water on odd numbered days of the month. Please limit your watering timeframe to morning and evenings to avoid evaporation. These restrictions apply whether you pull water directly from the lake or use water from the distribution system. As conditions change, we will put updates on Website for your use. These water rationing guidelines are also on page 87 of the Beaver Lake Handbook. We ask that you respectfully follow these guidelines to ensure that all property owners have the chance to water vegetation as well as maintain the level of our drinking water source. If the regulations are violated, Beaver Lake personnel have the authority to issue a violation of the Handbook rules. Rule 401 of the liquidated damages schedule provides that a \$50 fine may be imposed for a violation of Emergency water regulations. Please set or control your lawn watering schedule effective immediately. We appreciate your cooperation on this matter.

Beaver Lake Nature & Garden Club

Spring is right around the corner. WOW!! This is the time of year that most gardeners begin to think about what they will be planting this year. Our initial focus is on cold weather crops, as they can take cold for short periods. I use a handy little chart created from various sources to guide my planting and thought you might benefit.

Brussels Sprouts* and Potatoes can also tolerate some cold. I've never been able to get Brussels to grow very large though. If you know a trick, would love to hear from you.

Potatoes can tolerate 28-32 degrees. Listened to a podcast recently where they interviewed an expert from Wood Prairie Farms (they grow organic seed potatoes & other items). They suggest the Green Sprout method of starting potatoes:

Use seed potatoes about the size of an egg. Thirty days before the intended plant date (2 weeks before last frost date – April 30th here), put potatoes into a dark space that

is 70-75 degrees until you can see a sprout. Then bring into the light at 50 - 55 degrees. This shaves 10-14 days off of the growth cycle and prevents elongation of the sprout. Plant when soil temp 4 inches deep at 7 am is 50 degrees. If you cut your potatoes, leave at least two eyes and let sit for 2-3 days before planting. Potatoes can be grown in the ground or in containers or bags. Growing potatoes in a bag would be a fun project for kids – can never start them too early \bigcirc . As they grow, make sure potatoes are not exposed to the sun as that it what causes them to turn green. Keep them covered with dirt. Hope this was useful.

Warm weather crops, like peppers, should be planted after our last average frost date. Sources vary, but it's around the end of April.

Mowing Notice

Attention Please!

This notice is regarding your lot at Beaver Lake. This is your one and only notice to mow and maintain your lot and road right-of-way during the 2025 mowing season. You <u>will not</u> be given notice each time your lot needs mowed. If the length of the grass, weeds, or any other growth reaches or exceeds 15" in length (as stated in the Beaver Lake Handbook,) it

will be mowed under the direction of Beaver Lake Association at a cost of \$125 per mowing of the lot or \$62.50 per mowing of the ditch and/or embankments. The cost of the mowing will be billed to the owner of record.

Once the owner receives a bill for mowing, it must be paid within 30 days. After 30 days delinquent, the account is turned over to the Association attorney for processing. The Beaver Lake Association does not wish to be in the mowing business, so we are asking that you please make arrangements for your lot to be mowed and maintained until the growth stops in late October. Remember that the mowing responsibility includes the road right-of-way. If you have any questions about the location of your lot, please notify us at 402-235-2241. Mowing contractors can be found on the Beaver Lake website. Please utilize one of them and save yourself some money. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

▼ Important Election Information **▼**

Beaver Lake Association members have a choice of voting by proxy via email or in person at the clubhouse in our elections. All regular members get one ballot per feespaying membership, whether voting by proxy or in person.

Members who choose to vote by proxy must register each year on our website. Annual registration is available between January 1 and the last Friday in April. If you own multiple lots, register each one separately.

Proxy Voting

When you register to e-vote, you will need to provide your lot number, name of registered lot owner, and an email you can access during election weekend.

Be sure your lot number is correct. Be sure you can access that email during election weekend.

On the Friday evening of election weekend, you will receive an email with a link to your electronic ballot. Multiple lot registrants will receive separate emails for each lot. You will have until 3 pm on election Sunday to vote.

To vote, click the link to open your ballot, select your choices, confirm, and submit.

About two weeks before the annual meeting and election, all members will receive a notice of annual meeting and election, along with the list of candidates and their bios.

- Signing up for our email newsletter does NOT register you to e-vote.
- ► Previous registration to e-vote does NOT register you to e-vote in subsequent elections. Annual registration keeps our voter lists up to date.
- ► If you register to e-vote by proxy, you will be ineligible to vote in person too.

Those who do not register to e-vote by proxy may vote in person at the clubhouse on the day of the election.

Remember, if you want to vote by proxy in the coming election, registration begins in January.

Important Announcement: New Watercraft Pre-Approval Process

We are pleased to inform you about a new update regarding the acquisition of watercraft in our community. To enhance safety and compliance, we are introducing a pre-approval process for all new watercraft purchases.

Starting January 1, 2025, all "new-to-you" watercraft must submit a pre-approval request before bringing the watercraft into our community. This ensures that all new watercraft adhere to our safety and environmental standards.

How to Submit a Pre-Approval Request:

- Complete the Watercraft Pre-Approval Form available at https://forms.office.com/r/3QcHJi0tRV
- 2. Provide detailed information about the watercraft, including type, size, and safety features.
- 3. Submit the completed form online.

Once your request is reviewed, you will receive confirmation from the Beaver Lake Patrol office. Please ensure all newly purchased watercraft are approved before use to avoid any inconvenience.

burn Bans in Nebraska: What You Need to Know 🌖

As the weather warms up and outdoor activities increase, it's important to be aware of our communities' burn bans and fire safety regulations. Murray Fire and Rescue has seen firsthand how quickly fires can spread, especially during dry conditions. Following burn bans is not just about following the law—it's about protecting lives, property, and our communities. If the Murray Fire & Rescue District is in a burn ban, that information can be found on the sign in front of the fire station, on the Murray Fire & Rescue Facebook page as well as the Beaver Lake & Murray Village Facebook pages.

What Is a Burn Ban?

A burn ban is a temporary restriction on outdoor burning, put in place by state or local officials to reduce the risk of wildfires. In Nebraska, open burning is banned statewide unless specifically permitted by the local fire department or State Fire Marshal.



Common activities restricted under a burn ban include:

- Bonfires & Campfires
- Burning Leaves & Yard Waste
- ✓ Trash or Rubbish Fires
- Agricultural Burns (may require special permits)

Why Compliance Is Critical

Ignoring a burn ban can have serious consequences, including:

- Uncontrolled wildfires that destroy homes, farms, and wildlife habitats
- Strained emergency resources, pulling firefighters away from other emergencies
- Legal penalties, including fines and potential liability for damages

Fire Safety Tips

Even when burning is allowed, follow these safety tips:

- ✓ Keep a water source nearby (hose, bucket, or fire extinguisher)
- Never leave fires unattended
- Avoid burning on windy days
