

BLA Board of Directors Election Notice

⚠ Important Election Information ⚠

Beaver Lake Association members have a choice of voting by proxy via email or in person at the clubhouse in our elections. All regular members get one ballot per fees-paying membership, whether voting by proxy or in person.

Members who choose to vote by proxy must register each year on our website. Annual registration is available between January 1 and the last Friday in April. If you own multiple lots, register each one separately. [Register to E-Vote](#)

Proxy Voting

When you register to e-vote, you will need to provide your lot number, name of registered lot owner, and an email you can access during election weekend.

Be sure your lot number is correct. Be sure you can access that email during election weekend.

On the Friday evening of election weekend, you will receive an email with a link to your electronic ballot. Multiple lot registrants will receive separate emails for each lot. You will have until 3 pm on election Sunday to vote.

To vote, click the link to open your ballot, select your choices, confirm, and submit.

About two weeks before the annual meeting and election, all members will receive a notice of annual meeting and election, along with the list of candidates and their bios.

- ▶ Signing up for our email newsletter does NOT register you to e-vote.
- ▶ Previous registration to e-vote does NOT register you to e-vote in subsequent elections. Annual registration keeps our voter lists up to date.
- ▶ If you register to e-vote by proxy, you will be ineligible to vote in person too.

Those who do not register to e-vote by proxy may vote in person at the clubhouse on the day of the election.

Remember, if you want to vote by proxy in the coming election, registration begins in January.

Beaver Lake Patrol – New Watercraft Pre-Approval

To ensure all watercraft comply with the current Beaver Lake Handbook guidelines, completion of the [2026 Watercraft Pre-Approval Form](#) is mandatory for:

- Any watercraft not registered at Beaver Lake in 2025
- Any watercraft that is **NEW to you**.

This process helps us verify that your boat meets operational standards outlined in our handbook before it is allowed on the lake.

Please submit the form prior to purchasing or bringing your watercraft to Beaver Lake for registration. Failure to complete the pre-approval may result in delays in registration.

You must provide detailed information about the watercraft, including

- type
- size
- safety features

For approval of new watercraft, please **complete and submit this form**:

Once your request is reviewed, you will receive confirmation from the Beaver Lake Patrol office. Please ensure all newly purchased watercraft are approved before use to avoid any inconvenience.

2026 Lawn Watering Restrictions

Originally effective April 1, 2025, and still being enforced, all Beaver Lake Properties are under lawn watering restrictions due to the lake level being down as we move into spring. Lawn watering restrictions are enacted by the Board of Directors when the lake level is down 12" or more. Currently we are 17" low. You can see the current lake level and temperature by going to the link on the front page of the [Beaver Lake website](#). The lawn watering restrictions work as follows. If your address ends in an **even** number, you may water your lawn on **Monday, Wednesday and Friday** each week. If your address ends in an **odd** number, you may water on **Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday** of each week. Please limit your watering timeframe to morning and evenings to avoid evaporation. These restrictions apply whether you pull water directly from the lake or use water from the distribution system. As conditions change, we will put updates on Website for your use. These water rationing guidelines are also on page 86 of the Beaver Lake Handbook. We ask that you respectfully follow these guidelines to ensure that all property owners have the chance to water vegetation as well as maintain the level of our drinking water source. If the regulations are violated, Beaver Lake personnel have the authority to issue a violation of the Handbook rules. Rule 401 of the liquidated damages schedule provides that a \$50 fine may be imposed for a violation of Emergency water regulations. Please set or control your lawn watering schedule effective immediately. We appreciate your cooperation on this matter.

Mowing Notice

Attention Please!

This notice is regarding your lot at Beaver Lake. This is your one and only notice to mow and maintain your lot and road right-of-way during the 2026 mowing season. You **will not** be given notice each time your lot needs mowed. If the length of the grass, weeds, or any other growth reaches or exceeds 15" in length (as stated in the Beaver Lake Handbook,) it will be mowed under the direction of Beaver Lake

Association at a cost of \$125 per mowing of the lot or \$62.50 per mowing of the ditch and/or embankments. The cost of the mowing will be billed to the owner of record.

Once the owner receives a bill for mowing, it must be paid within 30 days. After 30 days delinquent, the account is turned over to the Association attorney for processing. The Beaver Lake Association does not wish to be in the mowing business, so we are asking that you please make arrangements for your lot to be mowed and maintained until the growth stops in late October. Remember that the mowing responsibility includes the road right-of-way. If you have any questions about the location of your lot, please notify us at 402-235-2241. Mowing contractors can be found on the Beaver Lake website. Please utilize one of them and save yourself some money. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

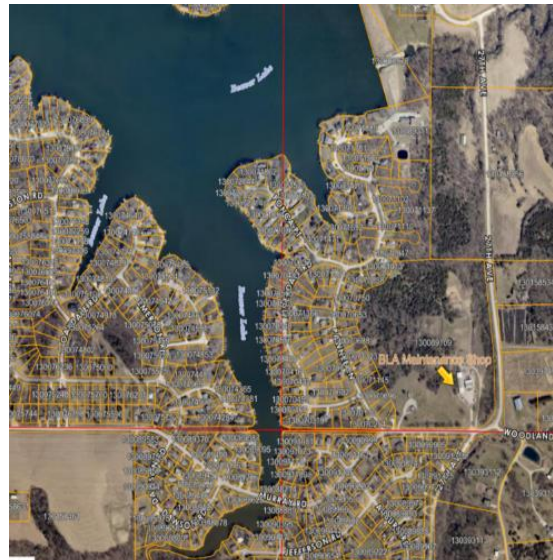

Nature & Garden Club

Recently, when we get together with neighbors, the conversation inevitably turns to the lake level and concerns regarding the lack of moisture this past year and the Lincoln wells. This prompted me to research predictions for spring weather in our area. This summarizes what I found: "... the spring 2026 forecast indicates a neutral, variable pattern with near-normal precipitation expected, but with lingering drought concerns." Source: AI Overview in Google, other sources said similar things.

While the overview from several sites was not 100% definitive, it made me wonder about what I could do to conserve water. There is some really good information out there so I thought I would share.

Indoor Water Conservation

- **Fix Leaks:** Repair dripping faucets, toilets, and pipes; a small leak can waste over 20 gallons daily. A leaky toilet can waste 200 gallons per day. That would be like flushing your toilet more than 50 times for no reason! Toilets are by far the main source of water use in the home — nearly 30 percent of all indoor residential water consumption
- **When Remodeling Upgrade Fixtures:** Install low-flow showerheads, faucet aerators, and high-efficiency toilets.
- **Bathroom Habits:**
 - Take shorter showers (under 5 minutes) instead of baths. If you keep your showers to under 5 minutes, you'll save up to 1,000 gallons a month.
 - Turn off the tap while shaving or brushing teeth. Savings: up to 4 gallons a minute, or up to 200 gallons a week for a family of four.
 - When washing your hands, turn off the water while you lather.
- **Kitchen:**
 - Wash only full loads of dishes, and select the appropriate water level or load size option on the dishwasher. Scrape dishes instead of rinsing them before loading.
 - Do not use water to defrost frozen foods. Thaw foods in the refrigerator overnight.
 - Compost food waste instead of using the garbage disposal or throwing it in the trash.
- **Water Usage:** Keep drinking water in the refrigerator rather than running the tap.
- **Reuse Water:** Collect water used for washing fruits and vegetables to water houseplants.
- **Laundry:**
 - Wash only full loads of laundry or use the appropriate water level or load size selection on the washing machine.
 - If replacing, consider purchasing a high efficiency washing machine, which can save over 50 percent in laundry water and energy use.

Outdoor Water Conservation

- **Landscaping:** Choose native, drought-tolerant plants that require less water.
- **Watering Habits:** Water lawns and gardens early in the morning to minimize evaporation. This prevents losing up to 50% of water to evaporation and wind during the day, while avoiding the disease risk associated with evening watering. In our case, follow any water restrictions dictated by the association.

- **Irrigation:** Use a broom to clean driveways and sidewalks instead of a hose. Install a rain barrel to capture water from gutters.
- **Mulch:** Apply mulch around trees and plants to retain soil moisture.

Cass County Emergency Management

As worded by EMA, effective immediately, Cass County is updating how tornado sirens are used.

Sirens activate in the warned area when National Weather Service issues a warning of tornado or a destructive tagged storm.

For a tornado warning, there will be one 3-minute siren activation for all locations in the warned polygon.

For any destructive tagged storm, there will be one 3-minute activation.

For any new tornado warned storm, there will be another one 3-minute activation.

For confirmed tornado on the ground identified by a public safety official or trained spotter sirens will sound for one 3-minute interval in the warned polygon.

There is no “all clear” siren. The sirens should not be relied on for any indoor notifications.

When sirens are activated, seek shelter immediately and obtain emergency information from reliable sources such as local media, NOAA Weather Radio, or National Weather Service. At least one battery operated device is encouraged.

Sirens are meant to reach outdoor listeners.

Murray Volunteer Fire Department

As dry weather settles into our community, it's a good time for a quick reminder about keeping our community safe from fire. When lawns, trees, and landscaping dry out, it doesn't take much for a small spark to turn into something more serious.

It's also worth being a little extra mindful with everyday activities. Things like mowing the lawn, using outdoor equipment, or grilling can all pose a higher risk when everything is dry. A little extra awareness—like avoiding the hottest parts of the day or making sure equipment is in good working order—goes a long way.

With the dry conditions, Governor Pillen has issued a burn ban. What is a burn ban, you ask?

A burn ban is a legally enforced regulation issued by local or state authorities that prohibits or restricts outdoor fires, including trash burning, campfires, and sometimes fireworks.



Effective March 28, 2026, Governor Jim Pillen re-issued a statewide burn ban, to help reduce the potential for additional wildfires in Nebraska. Dry and windy conditions have caused the spread of significant fires in the central and western parts of the state. Gov. Pillen issued an emergency proclamation activating the deployment of state resources to help combat fires, including the use of aircraft and personnel from the Nebraska National Guard. The Governor's executive order prohibiting burning will remain in effect until 11:59 p.m. on April 10.

We're all in this together, and small steps across the neighborhood can have a big impact. Staying aware of local burn restrictions, keeping communication open with neighbors, and looking out for one another helps keep everyone safer.

Thank you for doing your part to protect your home and our community. A few simple precautions now can help prevent much bigger problems later.

- 2026 Dues rates will be \$333.10 per quarter for a total of \$1332.40 for the year.
